Song written by Richard Thompson, first released by the Albion Band in 1978 and later included on Thompson's solo album *Small Town Romance* from a [solo performance](#) at the Bottom Line in NYC in 1982. We are basing our version on the latter and adding the last verse lyrics from a later soundtrack album for a 1990 BBC documentary [Hard Cash](#).

Notes on the music:
